WWC MASTERPLAN PHASE II BACKGROUND



WWC MASTERPLAN PHASE II CORE VALUES





- 1) To transition away from having a collection of nonreleasable animals to focusing on rehabilitation and reintroduction into the wild.
- 2) To improve animal safety and conditions for the rehabilitation and restoration of animal species.
- 3) To improve facility safety and efficiency for staff and volunteers.
- 4) To engage and immerse the public in the wildlife rehabilitation processes and native ecosystems.
- 5) To support propagation of at-risk species that will advance wildlife medicine and rehabilitation.
- 6) To make Willowbrook Wildlife Center more sustainable and energy efficient.



- Schematic design, alternatives analysis, facility research and updated probable estimates of cost
- 2) Master plan graphic update
- 3) Amending Village of Glen Ellyn's special use permit for Willowbrook Wildlife Center
- Visitor experience workshop and charrette
 (Discovery of potential visitor interactions and interpretive messaging)

SCHEDULE AND EXPENDITURES

- Spring/Summer 2021 Complete schematic design and amend special use permit through Village of Glen Ellyn. (\$435,000)
- Summer/Fall 2021 Negotiate contract for design development services and present to Board for approval. Upon approval complete design development work by winter 2021/2022. (\$250,000)
- Winter 2021/2022 Negotiate contract for construction/bid documents, permitting and bid assistance for multi-phased work and present to board for approval. Upon approval complete plans for outdoor rehabilitation phase I by spring 2022 and clinic, visitor center, outdoor rehabilitation phase II, SRC building renovation, and site work by winter 2022/2023. (\$635,000)

WWC MASTERPLAN PHASE II PROPOSED IMPLEMENTATION PLAN





SCHEDULE AND EXPENDITURES

- Spring 2022 Bid outdoor rehabilitation phase I work and present construction contract to Board for approval. Upon approval complete work by summer/fall 2022. (\$3,150,000)
- Winter 2022/2023 Bid new clinic and visitor center, outdoor rehabilitation phase II, demolition of old clinic, and renovation of species recovery building work. Negotiate contract for construction administration services and present both contracts to Board for approval. (\$540,000)
- Spring 2023 Winter 2025 Construct improvements as follows: New clinic ,visitor center and demolition of old clinic by summer 2024, outdoor rehabilitation phase II by fall 2024, and SRC building renovation by winter 2025. (\$18,690,000)

KEYNOTES AND MILESTONES

- New clinic and visitor center soft opening summer /fall 2024.
- All work completed by February 1, 2025
- Preserve will be closed to general visitors at times. However, it is anticipated that the Willowbrook Wildlife Center will be able to receive and rehabilitate wildlife at all times.
- Ribbon cutting anticipated spring 2025
